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| <p>WARM UP (validate existing knowledge)</p> | <p>Recap:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • “A philanthropist is someone who gives of themselves for the good of humanity. • We can help others using our philanthropic personalities and what makes us unique. • There are many different ways that people struggle. The Universal Challenges help us see that. • Today we are talking about challenges unique to being a young person. | |
| <p>NEW IDEAS (introduce and apply new content)</p> | <p>True or False “It is easy to be young.”</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Is this statement TRUE or FALSE? Why?” <p>Adora Video “Now we are going to watch a video by 12 year old Adora who presents the case that adults have a lot to learn from kids.”</p> <p>Reflection</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • THINK about why Adora’s message is important, impressive, or surprising. • PAIR up with someone and talk about the things you noticed. What do adults need to hear? • SHARE your thoughts with the group. | <p>15 min</p> |

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| <p>WRAP UP (reflect, gauge new learning)</p> | <p>Brainstorm</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• What do adults think kids struggle with?<ul style="list-style-type: none">◦ Write all your ideas on a large piece of paper. Come up with as many ideas as possible.◦ <i>Note: These could be anything from online bullying to peer pressure to school safety.</i>• What do kids actually struggle with?<ul style="list-style-type: none">◦ Write all your ideas on a separate large piece of paper. Come up with as many ideas as possible.◦ <i>Note: These could be anything from workload stress to social pressure, to being judged. Whatever comes to mind for them.</i>• Are the adult vs kids lists different?• We are going to take this brainstorm and use it later as a source of ideas for our podcast recordings.” | <p>15 min</p> |
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
