

# Service Learning Workshop Session 5

## **LESSON TITLE**

#### **OBJECTIVES**

- Validate the unique experience of being a young person. Help students see the unique perspective they have (vs adults).
- Validate the idea that it is not easy being a kid.

### **Our Perspective**

#### PREPARATION

- Gather nametags.
- Find way to collect answers to the two brainstorms -big paper, google doc or whatever works for you.

#### CURRICULUM

WARM UP (validate existing knowledge)	<ul> <li>Recap:</li> <li>"A philanthropist is someone who gives of themselves for the good of humanity.</li> <li>We can help others using our philanthropic personalities and what makes us unique.</li> <li>There are many different ways that people struggle. The Universal Challenges help us see that.</li> <li>Today we are talking about challenges unique to being a young person.</li> </ul>	
NEW IDEAS (introduce and apply new	<b>True or False</b> "It is easy to be young. • Is this statement TRUE or FALSE? Why?"	15 min
content)	<b>Adora Video</b> "Now we are going to watch a video by 12 year old Adora who presents the case that adults have a lot to learn from kids."	
	<ul> <li>Reflection <ul> <li>THINK about why Adora's message is important, impressive, or surprising.</li> <li>PAIR up with someone and talk about the things you noticed. What do adults need to hear?</li> <li>SHARE your thoughts with the group.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

WRAP UP	Brainstorm	15 min
(reflect,	<ul> <li>What do adults think kids struggle with?</li> </ul>	
gauge new	<ul> <li>Write all your ideas on a large piece of paper. Come up</li> </ul>	
learning)	with as many ideas as possible.	
-	<ul> <li>Note: These could be anything from online bullying to peer</li> </ul>	
	pressure to school safety.	
	<ul> <li>What do kids actually struggle with?</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Write all your ideas on a separate large piece of paper.</li> </ul>	
	Come up with as many ideas as possible.	
	<ul> <li>Note: These could be anything from workload stress to social</li> </ul>	
	pressure, to being judged. Whatever comes to mind for	
	them.	
	<ul> <li>Are the adult vs kids lists different?</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>We are going to take this brainstorm and use it later as a</li> </ul>	
	source of ideas for our podcast recordings."
