LESSON TITLE

OBJECTIVES

- Validate the unique experience of being a young person. Help students see the unique perspective they have (vs adults).
- Validate the idea that it is not easy being a kid.

CURRICULUM

WARM UP (validate existing knowledge)	 Recap: "A philanthropist is someone who gives of themselves for the good of humanity. We can help others using our philanthropic personalities and what makes us unique. There are many different ways that people struggle. The Universal Challenges help us see that. Today we are talking about challenges unique to being a young person. 	
NEW IDEAS (introduce and apply new	True or False "It is easy to be young. • Is this statement TRUE or FALSE? Why?"	15 min
content)	Adora Video "Now we are going to watch a video by 12 year old Adora who presents the case that adults have a lot to learn from kids."	
	 Reflection THINK about why Adora's message is important, impressive, or surprising. PAIR up with someone and talk about the things you noticed. What do adults need to hear? SHARE your thoughts with the group.
